





HUMAN'S RIGHTS South Ofrica

Human rights are the basic rights that all people have. In South Africa, these rights are listed in the Bill of Rights, which is part of the country's highest law, the Constitution. This document outlines the basic human rights that people in South Africa have, including rights for children.

CHILDREN'S RIGHTS South Ofrica

All children have the same basic human rights, but they need adults to make sure these rights are met. This is because children are still growing and cannot meet their own basic needs. For example, children need adults to provide food and a safe place to live. They also need adults to keep them safe and help them get an education. Children need adults to care for them, guide them, and support them until they can take care of themselves. These rights are protected by the South African Constitution.





Children have a right to an education that develops their personality and abilities, and encourages them to respect other people, cultures and the environment.



And they have the Responsibility to make the most of their education and encourage others to develop their abilities.

Children have a right to be treated fairly no matter who they are, where they are from, what language they speak, what they believe or where they live.



And they have the Responsibility always treat others fairly.

Children have a right to have adults always do what is best for them.

And they have the Responsibility to respect adults for doing what is best for them.



Children have a right to have their own opinion, which is listened to and taken seriously.

And they have the Responsibility listen to other people's opinions and take them seriously.



Children have a right to be protected from being hurt or badly treated in any way.



And they have the Responsibility not hurt others or treat them badly





Children have a right to the best health care and medical care possible and information to help them stay healthy.

And they have the Responsibility maintain good health and help others have access to good health care.



Children have a right to a basic standard of living that includes food, clothing and a safe place to live.





Children have a right to enjoy their own culture, religion and language, even if these are not the same as most people in their country.

And they have the Responsibility respect other people's culture, religion and language.




Children have a right to have a name and nationality.

Child ABUSE

Child abuse is when a child is hurt or neglected by a parent, a caregiver or anyone. This can include physical, sexual, emotional, or psychological harm. It can happen at home, school, or in other places where the child spends time.

TYPES OF ABUSE



Sexual abuse happens when a person touches a child in an uncomfortable way and against the will of the child. For example, when an old uncle touches a child's private parts even after he/she tells him to stop.




Emotional abuse happens when a person makes fun of or bullies another person in front of others. That means when a person does something to you that you don't like, while they know you don't like it. For example, when someone at school keeps on calling you 'stupid' or 'ugly' in front of others.




Physical abuse happens when someone hits, harms or beats another person to a point it hurts and bruises their body. For example, when a family member beats you up because you have done something wrong to a point you have bruises on your face.




Verbal abuse happens when people gossip or call you names. It can happen also when someone is constantly shouting at you using bad words. For example when one of your family members constantly shouts at you for being lazy and how you cannot do any of the house chores.



child Neglect is another type of child abuse. It is a form of child maltreatment, a failure in meeting a child's basic needs including the failure to provide basic physical, health care, supervision, nutrition, emotional, education and/or safe housing needs.









