

Back to Normal

For the most part of the year, the children were divided into small groups that didn't mix during the day, to limit the spread of the Corona-virus as much as possible. With the restrictions being eased in January 2022, we were able to continue classes as we were used to in a shared learning-space.

Impact evaluation

As part of an impact evaluation, parents and current class teachers were asked to assess the progress of our former learners.



All children were well adapted in the mainstream schooling system.



Compared to their class mates, the graduates performed either well or very well in school.



All children show an above-average level of independence and self-motivation.



All parents state that their children were well-prepared for primary school.

Parental work as integral part of holistic education

With the ease of lockdown restrictions, we were able to go back to regular parents meetings. This functions not only as informal gettogether and exchange platform, it also provides easy access to our social assistance team, enabling them to assist and support right where it's needed.

In a pilot-phase, three schools were selected to be trained in specific areas of the approach that can be translated easily into the context of an informal institution while potentially making huge impact on the quality of the service offered. The teachers participated in ten workshops of six hours each. Content and material was already developed in 2020 during lockdown, and the feedback from the participants has been exclusively positive. They expressed their wish for the training to continue in the future, and to roll-out a new cycle of trainings so that more ECDCs get the opportunity to benefit from the workshop series.

R²Campaign (Rights x Responsibilities)

Our Junior Learn4Life! groups facilitated multiple workshops in three local primary schools, reaching-out to over 1.000 of their peers, advocating for their rights and responsibilities as children. This was after they attended our spring camp with a special focus on human and children's rights, where we worked on the campaign's content and its presentation in the form of a booklet and button badges as hand-outs to their audiences.

Extended repertoire

Makhanda National Arts Festival Walmer Edition

For the Makhanda National Arts Festival 2021, Masifunde was selected to host the Gqeberha leg of the 'Standard Bank presents' series, including our own musical performance "Social Disturbing" as part of the main programme. A week before the show, lockdown level 4 was announced which led to the postponement of the events

Isakhono (mixed media arts exhibition presented online by our arts groups)

Telling stories that matter

The short poem recording "Sorry, Lufuno!" produced by our Drama Seniors in light of a bullying tragedy that hit the news beginning of the year, received a lot of attention, was aired on national television (SABC) and reached almost 300.000 people on social media.









On national TV

Our Grade 5 learner Imange was selected to feature in three episodes of Nal'ibali storytelling on national television. Our Masifunde Changemaker Academy and Walmer High School library hosted two of the filming sessions.

School Libraries

Afer a long covid-related hiatus, our school libraries were allowed to open and operate again. Walmer High School's Uthombo Wolwazi library serves 1.800 youth on a daily basis, while another 1.800 children have access to Ilitha Lethu library at Walmer Primary School.



Tailored online learning

In 2021, we were able to offer online education for main subjects, that allows us to track individual progress and intervene at an early stage by giving extra have access to it in the afternoon. Even our youngest, the pre-school learners,

Capacity building through mCon trainings

mCon provides relevant skills development for individuals and organisations in various fields, i.e. budgeting, project planning, computer literacy, admin and professional communication. All of our out-of-school youth receive vouchers that allows them to join trainings that is relevant to them and their chosen career path.

Each youth is individually assisted by a youth support agent throughout their journey to employment, ensuring that they are equipped to make use of opportunities that are opening up to them.



In-house opportunities for work experience and small incomes

Our trainee programme allows for selected youth to gain meaningful work experience over a period of six months, while receiving a small income that allows them to sustain themselves while taking further steps towards a sustainable career. Vocational trainees are place within our social enterprises (MyMito Cafeteria and Izandla Zethu Jewelery-making) as well as our running programmes (Learn4Life! and academic support programmes and pre-school after-care) and back-office structures (admin support). A further branch for sustainable building is added in 2022.



Masifunde Changemaker Network activating learners from in total 45 high schools in Nelson Mandela Bay, enabling them to spark positive change in their schools and communities.











Activation workshops

A 90-minute activation workshop was facilitated to Grade 9 learners in 13 high schools to encourage them to see themselves as potential changemakers who can promote equality and raise awareness about issues of public concern. In the workshop, the learners elected two of their peers to represent their school as changemaker and attend the one-week training.

There was an introductory focus on vulnerable groups such as women, children, LGBT+ persons and people living with disability, and through facilitated debates the learners discuss the discrimination and violation that vulnerable groups go through and how has the treatment been since the global Covid-19 pandemic.







Consistent with a well-intended trajectory of over 10 years of growth, high quality work and sustainable impact creation, we have gratefully received increased financial resources in 2021. Our income has once again grown as compared to previous years mainly as a result of a city-wide food-parcel initiative and the implementation of our changemaker network aiming at 45 high schools.


The income versus expenditure picture shows that we applied almost all the financial resources mobilized in 2021 towards realizing the set objectives during the year under review. We ended the year with a small surplus. In the year 2021 we have maintained a good mix of South African and international funders to support our organization's objectives. We have also diversified our sources of income through social enterprises such as our coffeeshop which are places of training for unemployed youth at the same time.

In 2022 and 2023 our fundraising focus will mainly be on financing the extension of our changemaker academy, building new class-rooms for


our Montessori pre-school and construction of an upcycled incubator and training venue for the youth - ideally all off-grid with our own borehole and solar-energy. We also work on new partnerships to role out our changemaker network nationwide.




Financial Development since 2010

Dear Stakeholders,

On behalf of the Masifunde's Board of Directors, I have the pleasure looking back at 2021, an operationally very successful and organisationally very stable year.

Our board is an honorary structure of advisory nature focusing on oversight of the governance of the organization and providing strategic direction. In our quarterly meetings, we hold Management accountable for the implementation of its responsibilities, effective use of available resources; and the maintenance of budgetary discipline.

As board of directors, we were proud to see how Masifunde navigated through the Corona years, adjusted its work to the needs of our communities (food parcels) and to the new realities of reaching our beneficiaries (TV, internet, magazines) in lockdown days. We saw all funders remaining loyal and even new funders joining our organisation initiating further growth of our work city-wide – and beyond.

We had hardly any staff turnover for the past couple of years, with key staff members serving in our organisation already five to ten years. We were glad to reward such loyalty by keeping all staff members at full pay throughout the past two years of corona crisis. And now, with new projects starting, we recruit additional staff making Masifunde one of the biggest if not the biggest employer in Walmer Township.

I'm not only addressing you as Masifunde's chairperson but also an active member and resident of the community of Walmer Township, a township with a rich history and a challenging presence. For over 15 years Masifunde serves the people of Walmer Township – reliability and consistency were key and built trust within the community. While many organisations came and left, Masifunde remained and is nowadays essential part of the community and key driver of change.

The list of amazing people and organisations supporting Masifunde generously is very long. I send out a sincere "Thank you very much" to every single supporter on behalf of the Board of Directors and on behalf of the people of Walmer Township!
